

Exceptional Academic Achievement at Riverside

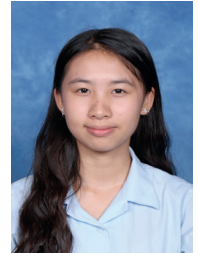
Determination and hard work deliver outstanding ATAR results
