### Business arising

1. Lisa Trapnell spoke to the meeting and showed a short video regarding the Gallop inquiry re workload vs staffing levels vs wages and how workloads have significantly increased for all teachers, but wages have not matched that. This year the Federation has said there will be strikes, which are not taken lightly by the teachers as they are not paid and the best way to get the word around to support teachers is by word of mouth. As the school is unable to circulate 'propaganda' via the school email, it was suggested that a parent Facebook page be set up if there isn't one already to help support the teachers.

1. Yr 12 study – awaiting quotes on correls (partitions) for the desks

4. Library – carpet and ceiling have been replaced. Roof took a lot longer to complete as they kept a lot of the spare tiles to reuse on the main roof. Trucks damaged the Yr 12 new lawn, but will fix it.

5. Uniforms – Blitz on NO HOODIES. Noone will have lots more of each part of the uniform in stock soon, the website link now also has a 'uniform' button taking users to a photo page. No-one is interested in the old uniforms, including Hunters Hill Council. The School is looking at selling the blazers, but are not able to advertise due to contractual issues, but will sell to those who want, need or ask for one. Vests from Stitchem will be given away for free, the 'forever' cardigan maybe not!
